Pat Cariseo: I was involved in putting together 3 publications focusing on the agency's history and anniversaries. Ted L. did the original, We Are All Safer, which was used as a guide for the others. Ted was one of the few who thought tracking the agency's history was important. Bob Barlett was also great at it. I think we changed it from We Are All Safer to Lessons Learned. They included a compilation of the most important investigations and recommendations. The last one was issued in 2007 to mark the 40th. I probably have a copy in a box somewhere or the graphic artist, if there still is one, has the electronic version. These publications used to be on the NTSB website, but I havent seen them there for the past few years. When I left, I was hoping the agency would give someone collateral duty of tracking the agency's history. When I worked on the project, all sorts of stuff was missing, or stuffed in boxes in the basement (I interceded once in saving a lots of documents from being tossed out) or a room off Public Affairs. Nuttin organized or catalogued and hundreds of pix with basic info lacking. I had to go to the Coast Guard archives cause we were missing dozens of marine reports and Embry-Riddle's website because they had a complete list of aviation reports on line and at the time, NTSB had none of its reports had been scanned prior to the early 80s. Hopefully that has changed. My suggestion is that Public Affairs should probably be tasked with putting together an updated publication for the 50th anniversary. As far as something representing the Silver Eagles, might be interesting to put together a compilation of interesting stories from retirees. (Stories! Assuming you mean old war stories from our time at the board – or current stories about life after? What...? shall we say 3 paragraphs or less for presentation at the 50th celebration.)
