Allen E. Lebo, (From the Washington Post) 74, an aircraft accident investigator for the National Transportation Safety Board and a musician who played clarinet and saxophone, died May 14 at an assisted living center in Reston, Va. The cause was congestive heart failure, said a daughter, Kendra Lebo.

Mr. Lebo, a resident of Sterling, Va., was born in Harrisburg, Pa. He retired from the NTSB in 2001 after 29 years of service. Earlier in his career, he had played clarinet and saxophone with the American Symphony Orchestra conducted by Leopold Stokowski and with the Marine Band.
