Healthcare Insurance Open Season: Federal Benefits Open Season – I changed to the new Self Plus One (SPO) enrollment type during this annual FEHB Open Season which ends on December 14, 2015. All change requests made during the FEHB Open Season will be effective January 1, 2016.

My first hint is that you have to register each year in order to change. Your last year's user name and password will not work. You have two options on the OPM site; sign in and register. Use the latter to set up your new sign-in info. You will need your Federal retiree number and the last 4 of your SSN. The number is on that flimsy card that was issued to you after you retired. It starts with 3 letters. The site will ask for the next 7 numbers. Apparently the last number on the card isn't part of your ID.

Next hint, look closely at your covered family members. My son was listed and he hasn't been eligible for 6 years. It is easy to delete members. If you are selecting Self plus one, then you will be asked to choose the one.
